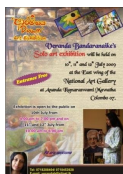

As with the first book, Brandon is unafraid to tackle themes that may deter a less confident author. This time, the focus is love in its many forms with a triangle at its heart and the message that when it comes to love, gender shouldn't be a concern. This book with its fast pace and credible characters is sure to generate as much controversy as the first and go on to be a best seller. In time, Brandon is likely to become as popular as the Portugese writer Paulo Coehlo.

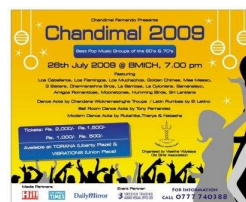

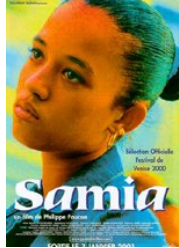

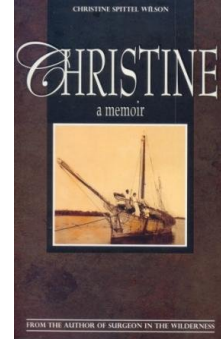
Dinner

Chesa Swiss,
Deal Place, Colpetty

On the corner of Deal Place and duplication Rd. or R.A. de Mel Mw., Chesa Swiss had long ago set the standard for European style fine dining in Colombo. You could count on having a well prepared, elegantly served meal that left a satisfying memory in your stomach at prices one would expect to pay for this type of luxury.

Recently however, my experience didn't live up to its expectation. The salad was average, the lobster bisque tepid – and this was probably the best of it. On a week night when we were in a practically empty restaurant, where waiters outnumbered diners, the waiters were whipping off the covers of the mains long before the first course was over. Why the haste? The duck was uncharacteristically tough – must have been of the hundred year variety. The venison however, was tender and succulent. Both dishes were accompanied by the same vegetables, giving the impression the kitchen was short on either ingredients or imagination. The house wine must move very slowly, for the carafe we had would have been better put to use as vinegar. At the end of the meal, I was ready to not like the desert and although I don't have a bad memory of it, I have no clear recollection either. I'm sorry to report the Chesa Swiss has 'gone down.'
